**Collision detectives hosting program Saturday to help teen drivers understand "crashes aren't accidents"**

Teen drivers and their parents are encouraged to attend the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office annual "Driving it Home" program aimed at cautioning newly-licensed drivers about the dangers of speed, alcohol and bad driving habits.

The program will be held from 9 a.m. to noon Saturday, March 28 at Stanwood High School at 7400 272<sup>nd</sup> St. NW. Collision investigators will review several local crashes and present a staged car-pedestrian crash outside the school. Teens and parents will hear testimonials from family members of fatal car crash victims. And an investigator from the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office also will make a presentation.

The event is free, but is not suitable for small children. No registration is required.
