### **Three Lynnwood-area convenience stores robbed by same man**

Snohomish County sheriff's detectives are looking for a man wanted in connection with three recent robberies at convenience stores – two in unincorporated Lynnwood and one in the city of Lynnwood.

The first robbery happened on Aug. 8 at 11:23 a.m. at a mini mart in the 20900 block of Cypress Way in unincorporated Lynnwood. The suspect walked in the store, brandished a knife and a plastic bag and demanded cash. He left with an undisclosed amount.

The second robbery happened on Aug. 19 at 9:34 p.m. at a mini mart located in the 6100 block of 176<sup>th</sup> St. SW in the city of Lynnwood. A suspect matching the description above displayed a knife and a plastic bag, demanded cash and left on foot with an undisclosed amount of money.

The third robbery happened Monday (Sept. 5) at 11:02 p.m. at a convenience store located in the 3600 block of 164<sup>th</sup> St. SW in unincorporated Lynnwood. Once again, the suspect walked in the store, displayed a knife, a plastic bag and demanded cash. Once again, he fled on foot after getting an undisclosed amount of money.

No one was injured in any of the robberies.

The suspect is described as a black male in his 20s or 30s, more than 6 feet tall and weighing between 230 and 260 lbs. In each of the robberies he has worn dark clothing. In the third robbery he also wore a baseball cap and appeared to cover part of his face for a short time with red bandana.

It's possible the suspect is associated with a white Ford Mustang passenger car made sometime after 2000.
